Re: James' *Dohrman Prophecy* and its 16/20/12/9/3/11/8. Other meanings that can be found here are:

1620 was the year The Mayflower, full of religious refugees, departed England for the new world to escape the religious tyranny of Europe. <http://www.history.com/this-day-in-history/mayflower-departs-england>

2012 was the year in recent times that most threatened a massive CME, which is the cause of Sunrot in Weather Composer.

1293 the year of a massive earthquake in Japan that took 30,000 lives. <https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/1293>. Difficult to see the relevance of this to DP and us today, however.

3/11 the Tohoku earthquake (actually seaquake) and tsunami disaster that took 20,000 lives.

9/11 that changed our path and birthed global terrorism. (With a religious base?)

79 is the number of divine brotherhood. It would adequately fit a papacy though I do not know if the Catholic Church has used it. Seven is the number of the divine or spiritual, and nine the number of being a big brother or leader for humanity, either beneficial or not. Pope Francis is 79 right now, but was not of course, when James wrote DP.

The current N. Ireland flag is the red diagonal X on a white background as found in the Union Jack.

The flag you have for N. Ireland there, shima, is absorbing in its imagery. No one ever talks about this. I have only mentioned it to a few people over the years. If my impression about this is accurate, and it is not all feeling, as others have also researched this (see the sources), you may come to appreciate the general silence. So I shall end my silence on it here.

Its imagery is as old as the Bible and the beginning of the line of kings to come forth from Jacob's line. I am going from memory here somewhat so forgive me if I err slightly, you may need to check up on the facts. The center imagery has a white Star of David, or Judah, with a red hand inside. The hand points up to the crown which it recognizes; or does it claim? Wikipedia gives only scant, incomplete information on this. It correctly points out the Ulster connection but does not mention that originally there was a string surrounding the hand before the image was put on the flag in 1920. This original symbol was/is the Red Hand and cord of Zara-Judah. This Judah is separate from the Tribe of Judah in Israel.

The following is my summary on the matter from *Symbols of our Celto-Saxon Heritage* by Bennett published by the Canadian British Israel Association.

The story begins thousands of years ago with the 12 tribes of Israel. Within these tribes, the promise of an entire line of future high kings was foretold to come forth from Jacob, specifically from his son Judah, from whom came the House of Judah. Judah had some sons, but the significant ones in this story are the twins. It was one of these twins that was to be the source of the line of future kings (and queens). However, which one? The answer is the one that came out first: the firstborn. At delivery, however, a hand came out first. Due to the problematic delivery, a red string was tied around the hand for recognition of the one that came out first. The hand then withdrew back into the womb. Finally, a birth occurred, but it was the other baby that delivered first, not the one with the red string around the wrist or hand. The baby with the scarlet cord was Zarah and the one who came out whole first was called Pharez. Here began an argument that it seems persists right up to our present day. Both claimed to be the first born and therefore the rightful heir of the future crown. The judgment went to Pharez, and Zarah and his followers considered themselves robbed of their rightful inheritance.

The split occurred with the Zara branch leaving the Tribe of Judah in Israel. Zara's great grandson Calcol eventually left the Middle East and went to Spain where the tribe founded Zaragossa. They were still Hebrews, descended from Abraham through Eber or Heber, and they left their name where they traveled. The river in Zaragossa still bears their name Eber. The land itself became called Iberia, the land of the Hiberi or Hebrews. Moving on from Iberia (present-day Spain) they settled in what we call Ireland. Zarah-Judah founded the Kingdom of Ulster -- note the wording **Kingdom** -- around 1600. Since this time the emblem of Ulster has been a Red Hand circled with a Scarlet Cord. The cord was dropped from the flag after the division of Ireland in 1920. The ancient and traditional emblem of Ulster is said to remain the Red Hand circled by a Scarlet Cord. The hand is red due to the blood of birth. Sarah, as you know, is a common Irish name; and Ireland is called Eire, which is often pronounced *airah* as in Sarah and Zarah.

I would suggest that the crown over the hand shows their claim to the throne and crown that they think, or thought, are rightfully theirs. So is Wikipedia right that they accept the crown? I am sure they do, but which crown: theirs or the British? The British will say there is only one crown, but others may have a different story to tell. Alternatively, have the Irish relinquished this ancient claim in the last century, and now that they are a part of Britain recognize the English crown only? Whatever, this ancient

royal claim can throw light on the contentious relations that have dogged British-Irish relations throughout the centuries, with the real cause hidden from the public.

In fact, the Irish moved up into Scotland founding the Hebrides and the Outer Hebrides, and the Scottish too have long had their claim to the throne and crown. The original Scottish constitution bore witness to their Middle Eastern Hebraic origins.

You might see a kind of parallel with the struggle occurring within the pages of DP, but I shall leave that for you to ponder for yourselves.
